

SCEC Qualification Requirements

The NMIT certificate III in Locksmithing is AQF compliant and meets the requirements for a qualification for SCEC accreditation. This Certificate III course has been designed after extensive consultation with industry. The course has been developed to provide extensive relevant training for working in the Locksmithing industries.

The most common pathway to obtaining the Certificate III in Locksmithing is by a conventional apprenticeship in Locksmithing.

For those who may not have had the opportunity to complete an apprenticeship, there is an alternative pathway of RPL (Recognition of Prior Learning).

The Fee for RPL maybe as little as \$450.00

After you have completed the RPL process and possible skills gaps are identified you may undertake training and assessment to be deemed competent in those areas.

Gap training is offered through placement in existing classes when class numbers and content allow. The minimum fee is \$670.00. The fee may covers up to 40 hours of gap training.

One to one gap training is also available at \$180.00 per hour with a minimum of 4 hour training.
